

TRUST'S AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

ENHANCING COLLEGE EXPERIENCE

To provide and maintain enhanced facilities for our students, and to support and facilitate the development of College clubs and societies.

FURTHERING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

To increase support available for undergraduate and postgraduate students undertaking travel or fieldwork for academic purposes, and to provide an environment conducive to exercise of interdisciplinary intellectual curiosity.

STRENGTHENING ENDOWMENT

To help provide the College with the financial health to meet new challenges as they arise and, in the longer term, to ensure more students have access to hardship funding and financial support from the Trust.

COLLEGE EXPERIENCE: THE SOCIETIES

THE COLLEGE CHOIR

One of Durham's oldest and finest Chapel Choirs, the Hatfield Choir have recently performed at Strasbourg, Düsseldorf, York Minster, Durham and Hereford. The Choir performs a challenging repertoire to the highest level, regularly appearing at college events and weekly evensong services. Recently, with the Trust's support, the Choir have undertaken an ambitious fundraising challenge to make an appearance in Canada and the USA.



SHAPED

SHAPED Programme encourages Hatfield students to make the most of their time at College and thanks to this initiative, last year over 100 students achieved Hatfield Award. Our dedicated team of volunteers also supports the finalists, acting as a referral to graduate recruitment services and jobs. In order for the group to reach even more students the Hatfield Trust recently agreed to sponsor SHAPED's brand new website.





THE BOAT CLUB

- Due to the continuing generosity of our alumni and parents we were able to purchase a new racing VIII for our students for £26,400. In fact, it is using this boat that our women's squad managed to secure 53rd place, out of 240 starters, in the recent "Thames Head of River Race". They were the fastest college crew in the country.
- Thanks to a substantial gift of £14,500 from a parent, the women's squad now has a brand new racing IV, made to our specifications.
- The Trust also paid for eight new ergo machines to enhance the training programme over the rowing year, an invaluable addition during winter and spring, when the Wear is likely to flood.










THE COLLEGE BAND

THE EDINBURGH FRINGE

To promote the work of the Lion Theatre company, the Trust contributed £2,000 which enabled students to perform at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival.

'Without the grant from The Hatfield Trust, Lion Theatre Company would have never had the funds to take this show to Edinburgh. (...) Getting exposure for shows as someone interested in drama is difficult in Durham, but the Edinburgh Fringe is the largest arts festival in the world; what better stage on which to present a stimulating new piece of writing?' writes the president Tom Wills.






THE LIONS' NETWORK

COLLEGE EXPERIENCE: THE TRAVEL AWARDS


Travel awards are amongst our most popular bursary schemes to help students with their educational, charitable and personally challenging endeavours during the summer months.

Due to your continued generosity our students are able to travel far and wide to reach their potential. This year we spent $\pm 10,000$ on travel awards, almost doubling the support we were able to offer in previous years.

Some of the named travel awards which we use to support students include the Howard Phelps and Simon McNamara Awards which support humanitarian, educational and personally challenging activities. Moreover, our annual Drinkwater Award provides $\pounds 250$ to a student who travels abroad on a project which involves using a language not studied at University.

CHARLES'S TRIP TO UGANDA


Our Travel awards provide amazing opportunities for our students' personal development and Charles' report from Uganda highlights just that: "Thirty one days, two national parks, and scores of friendly Ugandans has taught me more about myself, than 19 years in UK has, or ever could. Thanks to funding from the Hatfield Trust Travel Fund during the months of July and August I worked as a Social Media and Communications Intern at Conservation Through Public Health (CTPH). (...) Flights, accommodation, food, vaccinations and other expenses form a, sometimes overwhelming, financial barrier to any trip such as this. The Hatfield Trust's generosity helped remove this barrier allowing my dream to turn into reality."

ELÉONORE'S CONFERENCE IN EDINBURGH

With the ongoing pressure for conventional computers to perform increasingly complex tasks whilst reaching infinitesimal scales, physical limitation have started to slow down the growth of the industry. Finding alternative computing paradigms is thus paramount. Eléonore's PhD project involves modifying the properties of nanocomposites until they are able to compute, and her results were promising enough to be presented and published. The Trust has supported her project by allowing her to attend the international conference in Parallel Problem Solving From Nature (PPSN 2016) in Edinburgh.

ACADEMIC AWARDS

With your continuous support the College is able to offer 29 different academic awards and scholarships to help our students be the best that they can.

This year alone we spent over £20,000 on educational grants and bursaries to support our students' academic excellence.

Your academic support means that our students are able to make a real impact on an international level; with Jing travelling to San Francisco, Pammi attending a conference in Stockholm and Alexia taking her research to the Biennial Meeting of the International Society for Eye Research in Tokyo.





YOU COULD CONTRIBUTE TOWARDS:

- Postgraduate Research Fund offering Hatfielders access to a variety of high quality research events.
- Bursaries for Independent Research within the UK, which help to cover the costs of research and fieldwork for undergraduate and postgraduate students.
- Floreat Fund awards (each valued at £1000) presented to six Hatfield students annually, to encourage their progress from undergraduate to postgraduate study.
- The Hatfield History Prize, which provides our History students an access to books of direct relevance to their dissertation.
- Alternatively you could set up a new prize perhaps named after you, your family member, or your company.

THE HATFIELD TRUST LEARNING CENTRE

Due to your continuing generosity, last year the Trust paid for new Library shelving and furniture and as a thank you, our library will be named the 'Hatfield Trust Learning Centre'. We also contributed to the redesigning of the computer room by providing the furniture which added some valuable work space. The Den will provide a new multifunctional space for the College, ensuring we have more room for socialising, study and performance shows.

The new design will involve extending the bar to incorporate the current covered walkway and fitting the exterior with a glazed façade allowing natural light into the room.

Moreover, the new exterior landscaping is designed to create an external seating area and provide a ramped access into the Den.

THE LIONS' DEN

Although the Hatfield Trust has pledged $\pounds 100,000$ (half the cost of the project) and the Junior Common Room has agreed to add a further $\pounds 15,000$ we still need your support in order to raise the remaining $\pounds 85,000$.



NAMING OPPORTUNITIES


The College are inviting alumni to name key buildings on the college campus.

INVESTMENTS



"Hatfield College of Durham University," can be nominated as a recipient of your Self Invested Personal Pension.





The fund financially supports students who are unable to participate in extra-curricular activities as a result of financial hardship so that every student can enjoy the full Hatfield experience.




Alumni Support
